COST THEREOF**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
RARITAN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY** (not less than two-thirds
of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Raritan, in the County of Hunterdon, New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$791,700.00, and further including the aggregate sum of \$38,506.90 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$753,193.10 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local

Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 17.38 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$753,193.10, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$158,340 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The Township hereby makes the following covenants and declarations with respect to obligations determined to be issued by the Chief Financial Officer on a tax-exempt basis. The Township hereby covenants that it will comply with any conditions subsequent imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), in order to preserve the exemption from taxation of interest on the notes, including, if necessary, the requirement to rebate all net investment earnings on the gross proceeds above the yield on the notes. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to act on behalf of the Township to deem the obligations authorized herein as bank qualified for the purposes of Section 265 of the Code, when appropriate. The Township hereby declares the intent of the Township to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with its undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE #17-36

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RARITAN, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, NEW JERSEY, AMENDING TITLE 6 ENTITLED "ANIMAL CONTROL" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RARITAN TO REVISE PROVISIONS RELATED TO LATE FEES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Raritan, in the County of Hunterdon and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1 Section 6.04.020 entitled "Licensing and Registration of Dogs and Cats" of Title 6 entitled "Animal Control" of *The Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Raritan* is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.04.020 Licensing and Registration of Dogs and Cats.

- A. *License Required.* It is the responsibility of every person who shall own, keep or harbor a dog or cat of licensing age to annually, during the months of April or May, apply for and procure from the Township Clerk a license and official metal registration tag for each such dog or cat so owned, kept or harbored. No person shall keep or harbor any dog or cat within the Township without first obtaining a license, to be issued by the Township Clerk upon application of the owner and payment of the prescribed fee. Such license shall be obtained within ten (10) days of a dog or cat attaining the age of seven (7) months or permanent teeth or within ten (10) days of the acquisition of a dog or cat that is determined to be of licensing age. Any person who shall bring or cause to be brought into the State of New Jersey, Township of Raritan a dog or cat licensed in another state for the current year shall immediately apply for a license issued by the Township. No person shall keep or harbor any dog or cat in the Township except in compliance with the provisions of this chapter and with the provisions of Chapter 151 of the Laws of 1941 of the State of New Jersey. Failure to comply with this subsection A of this ordinance shall be deemed a violation and subject to a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each offense. Each and every day in which a violation of this subsection exists shall be considered a separate violation. (Ord. 13-18)
- B. *Registration Required.* Any person who shall bring or cause to be brought into the Township any dog or cat licensed in another New Jersey municipality for the current year, for a period to exceed ten (10) days shall, within ten (10) days, apply for a registration tag for each dog or cat for a registration fee of fifty cents (\$0.50). Such registration shall be valid until May 31st of the current Raritan Township licensing year.
1. *Applications, Contents and Preservation of Information.* The application shall state if the dog or cat has been neutered, the breed, sex, age, color and markings of the dog or cat for which license and registration are sought and whether it is of a long, medium or short-haired variety; also, the name, telephone number, street and post office address of the

owner and the person who shall keep or harbor such dog or cat. The information on the application and the registration number issued for the dog or cat shall be preserved for a period of three (3) years by the Clerk or other local official designated to license dogs and/or cats in the municipality.

- 2. License Forms and Tags.. License forms and official tags shall be furnished by the municipality, shall be numbered serially and shall bear the year of issuance and the name of the municipality.
- 3. Evidence of Inoculation for Rabies Requirement for License. No Municipal Clerk or official designated by the governing body of any municipality to license dogs or cats therein shall grant any such license and official registration tag for any dog or cat, unless the owner thereof provides evidence that the dog or cat to be licensed and registered has been inoculated with a rabies vaccine which cannot expire through the first ten (10) months of the licensing year. (Ord. 07-19 § B3).

C. *Renewal of License—Registration Tag.* It is the responsibility of any person who shall own, keep or harbor a dog or cat of licensing age to annually, during the months of April or May, apply for and procure from the clerk a license and official metal registration tag for each such dog or cat so owned, kept or harbored.

- 1. *Display of License.* Every person who shall own, keep or harbor any dog or cat licensing age, shall place upon such dog or cat a collar or other device, with the license number securely fastened or displayed thereto. Acceptable methods of displaying the license number shall include, but are not limited to, breakaway or elastic collars. License tags are not transferable. Failure to comply with this subsection C shall be deemed a violation and subject to a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each offense. Each and every day in which a violation of this subsection C exists shall constitute a separate violation. Should such tag be lost a duplicate registration tag may be obtained for a fee of fifty cents (\$0.50) from the Clerk’s office. (Ord. 13-18)

D. *Fees.* The fee for a license and registration tag for all dogs and cats which are spayed or neutered shall be twelve dollars (\$12.00) for one (1) year. For any dog or cat which is to be licensed which is not spayed or neutered, the fee for a license and registration tag shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for one (1) year. Every dog and cat shall be required to have a separate license and registration tag. The license and registration tag shall be effective for the period beginning on June 1st and ending on the succeeding May 31st. (Ord. 07-4 § D; Ord. 13-18)

E. *Late Fees.* Any owner of a dog or cat that has not received a license and registration tag by the Required Date (as defined below) shall be charged a Late Fee. For the purposes of this subsection, the term “Required Date” shall mean, (i) for a dog or cat previously licensed and registered with the Township, June 1st, or (ii) the later to occur of the date that a pet is newly

acquired after June 1st or, in the case of a newly acquired dog, the date on which the dog reaches seven (7) months of age. For the purposes of this subsection the term "late fee" shall mean a charge that equals the sum of five (\$5) dollars per dog or cat per month that said pets are not timely licensed and registered in accordance with this Chapter, after the lapsing of the aforesaid one month "grace period"; provided, however, that under no circumstances shall the aggregate amount of late fees exceed fifty (\$50) dollars per household, irrespective of the number of pets in such household.

[Any license and registration tag issued for a dog or cat previously registered with the Township beginning on June 1st shall have an additional fee as a late charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). Dogs or cats which are new pets and being licensed for the first time after June 1st shall be permitted to be licensed without the additional charge as a late fee providing that the licensing is done as soon as the dog reaches seven (7) months of age or if the dog is older, within thirty (30) days of having obtained the dog or cat. If an owner of a new dog or cat fails to secure the license within the thirty (30) days after the dog or cat attains the age of seven months or fails to secure a license within the thirty-day (30) period after having obtained the dog or cat, he or she will incur the late fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). (Ord. 06-16 § E)]

- F. *Loss of License.* If a license tag has been misplaced or lost, the Township Clerk may issue a duplicate license and/or registration tag for that particular dog or cat at a fee of fifty cents (\$0.50).
- G. *Proof of Licensing.* Proof of licensing shall be produced by any person owning, keeping, maintaining or harboring a dog or cat, upon the request of any health officer, police officer, animal control officer, animal census taker or other authorized person.
- H. *Disposition of Fees Collected.* License fees and other moneys collected or received under the provisions of this chapter shall be forwarded to the state of New Jersey and the treasurer of the municipality and shall be placed in a special account separate from any of the other accounts of the municipality and shall be used for the following purposes only: collecting, keeping and disposing of dogs or cats liable to seizure for local prevention and control of rabies; providing antirabies treatment under the direction of the local board of health for any person known or suspected to have been exposed to rabies; conducting rabies inoculation clinics; annual dog and cat census taking; and for administering the provisions of this chapter. For any unexpected balance remaining until the end of the third fiscal year following, and at the end of each fiscal year thereafter, there shall be transferred from such special account to the general funds of the municipality, any amount then in such account which is in excess of the total amount paid into the special account during the last two fiscal years next preceding.

I. *Unauthorized Removal or Attachment of Registration Tags.* No person, except an officer in the performance of his or her duties, shall remove a registration tag from the collar of any dog or cat without the consent of the owner, nor shall any person attach a registration tag to a dog or cat for which it was not issued.

J. *Waiver of Licensing and Registration Fees.* Dogs used as guides for blind persons and commonly known as seeing-eye dogs, or dogs used to assist deaf persons and commonly known as hearing ear dogs, shall be licensed and registered as other dogs herein above provided for, except that the owner or keeper of such dog(s) shall not be required to pay any fee therefor. Cats used on a legitimate working farm shall be licensed and registered as other cats herein above provided for, except that the owner or keeper of such cat(s) shall not be required to pay any fee therefor.

Section 2. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 3. The Ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption, passage and publication according to law.

\$500,000 in Grants Available for Soil and Water Conservation Projects on Preserved Farms

Agriculture Secretary Douglas H. Fisher today announced that \$500,000 is available in cost-sharing grants to farmers and landowners to help them implement soil and water conservation projects on preserved farms.

“Conserving soil and water resources is essential to maintaining the productivity of preserved farmland and sustaining our agricultural industry,” said Secretary Fisher. “The State Agriculture Development Committee (SADC) is pleased to be able to offer these cost-sharing grants to assist farmers in undertaking projects that conserve natural resources and promote strong farming operations.”

Through a memorandum of understanding with the SADC, the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) will be providing technical assistance to applicants and will assist landowners in planning and implementation of conservation practices in support of the Soil and Water Conservation Grant program. Landowners should apply for soil and water conservation grants at their local NRCS office. Completed applications will be forwarded by NRCS to the State Soil Conservation Committee, which will approve and recommend eligible projects to the SADC for funding.

Acting State Conservationist Christine Hall said, “NRCS professionals offer technical expertise that will help producers plan and implement soil and water conservation practices that will safeguard the valuable resources being protected through farmland preservation.”

The SADC will provide 50 percent cost-sharing for eligible projects. Maximum grant amounts will be determined by acreage under common deed ownership. The grants are funded by legislation recently signed into law by Governor Christie that appropriated \$65.3 million for farmland preservation, including \$1.5 million for soil and water conservation grants and other stewardship activities on preserved farms.

Landowners and farmers are eligible to apply for grants for projects on farms that are permanently preserved or enrolled in an eight-year preservation program. Under an eight-year program, landowners agree to voluntarily restrict nonagricultural development for a period of eight years and become eligible for certain benefits, including soil and water conservation grants.

Soil and water conservation projects include those designed to control and prevent soil erosion and sediment damages; control pollution on farmland; impound, store and manage water for agricultural purposes, and improve management of land and soils to achieve maximum agricultural productivity.

Examples of eligible projects include terrace systems; diversions; stream protection; water impoundment reservoirs; irrigation systems; sediment retention, erosion or water control structures; drainage systems; animal waste control facilities; agri-chemical handling facilities, and forest tree stand improvement.

The SADC administers New Jersey's Farmland Preservation Program and promotes innovative approaches to maintaining the viability of agriculture. To date, approximately 2,500 farms covering 227,000 acres have been permanently preserved under the program. WHEREAS, the Township acquired land located along Clover Hill Road, identified as Block 75, Lot 7.01, consisting of approximately 18.6 acres, for use as a public park for recreational purposes (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Property was granted to the Township for use as a public park for recreational purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Flemington Soccer Club ("Flemington Soccer") expressed to the Township a desire to develop the Property as a recreational public park on behalf of the Township; and

WHEREAS, Flemington Soccer and the Township negotiated over the development and use of the Property for its youth soccer program, which benefits the youth in Raritan Township, in addition to other organizations, groups and members of the public; and

WHEREAS, Flemington Soccer and the Township have entered into a lease agreement for the use of the Property ("the Lease"), adopted by the Township through ordinance 2008-35, which governs the development, construction, maintenance and scheduling of use of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Flemington Soccer has indicated by way of a letter to the Township, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", that the limitation in daylight hours, brought on by the change in seasons, has significantly impacted its ability to provide adequate training; and

WHEREAS, Flemington Soccer now wishes to use temporary portable lights to illuminate portions of the Property at night in order to allow for adequate training to its sports teams during September, October and November; and

WHEREAS, Section 22 of the Lease requires that lighting systems that are to be installed on the property must receive site plan approval pursuant to Section 16.20.040(G) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Raritan; and

WHEREAS, the lighting systems proposed by Flemington Soccer do not require site plan approval because they are temporary in nature and thus are not "structures" pursuant to the Township's Land Development ordinance; and

WHEREAS, in any event, a municipality may exempt itself from its zoning regulations for development on municipally-owned property per Hills of Troy v. Parsippany, 391 N.J. Super. 593 (Law Div. 2005); and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Raritan has determined that it is in the best interests of the Township and the public to allow for Flemington Soccer to place temporary lights on the Property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Raritan, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that Flemington Soccer shall be allowed to place temporary lights on the Property, without the need to secure site plan approval.

1. The term of the Township's approval for the use of temporary lights on the Property shall begin upon the adoption of this resolution by the Township Committee and shall terminate on December 31, 2017. Any future request for temporary lighting shall be presented to the Township Committee at least 45 days prior to the date Flemington Soccer desires to use the temporary lights.
2. Flemington Soccer shall provide to the Township Administrator proof of additional insurance related to the use of its temporary lights prior to their use.
3. Flemington Soccer shall designate members to turn on and turn off its temporary lights.
4. Flemington Soccer shall only use its temporary lights during the months of October and November, 2017.
5. Flemington Soccer will remove its temporary lights from the Property before November 30, 2017.
