David Dockery, Esq., of the firm Becker & Poliakoff, representing the Mountain View at Hunterdon Homeowners' Association, began to express concerns on behalf of the homeowners regarding Toll's request for the release of performance guarantees.

Mr. Purcell advised Mr. Dockery that he will have an opportunity to speak at the scheduled public hearing on tonight's agenda.

There was no further public comment.

PUBLIC HEARING – Request of Toll NJ, LLP for release of Performance Guarantees for project known as Mountain View at Hunterdon, Block 44, Lot 24

Mayor Kuhl asked for a motion to open the public hearing.

MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED

Mr. Purcell explained that a public hearing is required prior to the release of performance guarantees for subdivision developments and that Toll NJ, LLP is seeking the release of its guarantees due to the completion of required public improvements. Mr. Purcell continued that Toll will be required to post a maintenance bond for those improvements for a two-year period.

Mayor Kuhl solicited public comment.

The following members of the public spoke during public comment:

Mr. Dockery advised that developer control transitioned to owner control on September 17, 2019 and that the Homeowners Association (“HOA”) had only received the Township Engineer’s report on October 11, 2019. Mr. Dockery continued that his firm had issued a letter on behalf of the HOA objecting to the bond release due to certain issues including the following:

- *sidewalk, pavement repairs;
- *unsafe conditions surrounding the construction trailer (requesting proper maintenance, fencing, landscaping);
- *drainage;
- *unsafe conditions of the detention basin.

Mr. Dockery explained that he is seeking a continuation of the public hearing to allow the HOA’s engineer ample time to review the reports.

Tony Hajjar, Township Engineer, commented that “most of the stuff has been done and Toll is willing to redo some of the items that are in my list but they fall under a maintenance agreement, as they are already built.” He further commented, “it is to my understanding that the office trailer is there for the benefit of the homeowners regarding warranty issues and will remain on site until the beginning of Spring.” Mr. Hajjar advised that the Township will be retaining a \$51,000.00 performance bond for several items that will be completed by the Spring.

Committee Member Reiner voiced no objection to the delay of action until the next regular meeting and spoke not in favor of any further delay if the requirements are met.

Committee Member Gilbert concurred “given the fact that they had less than two business days to read a document and digest that document and have their professional react.”

Committee Member Hazard expressed support in favor of carrying to the next regular meeting.

During the public hearing, Committee Member Mangin inquired if the maintenance bond could be increased. Mr. Hajjar explained that the maintenance bond is fifteen percent (15%) of the original improvements or \$835,000.00 for two years. Mr. Purcell added that the Township Committee has forty-five (45) days to act from the date of the Township Engineer’s memo.

It was the consensus of the Township Committee to carry the public hearing and table action to the November 6, 2019 regular meeting.

Committee Member Gilbert inquired about the expenses in the Planning/Engineering Escrow report for Poly Patel Hotel/Restaurant. Mr. Hajjar advised that all stormwater management is complete, that the foundation has been started, and that the project is moving forward.

- Karen Gilbert: Environmental Commission/Green Team; Historians; Open Space; Parks and Recreation; Planning Board (Class III Member)
Committee Member Gilbert reported that the Environmental Commission has been involved with the distribution and collection of well testing kits as well as with the tree planting held October 5 at Walnut Brook; that discussions are ongoing with the Local Historians Committee regarding renovations to the schoolhouse; and that the Open Space Committee will be touring additional properties. Committee Member Gilbert advised that Mayor Kuhl and Mayor Driver of Flemington Borough had met to discuss the future of the Joint Parks and Recreation Committee for which there are items on tonight's agenda. Committee Member Gilbert also reported on a meeting of the Planning Board advising of the approval of an application by Summit Custom Spray for the installation of another drying apparatus to address ongoing odor complaints within the community.

Committee Member Hazard announced the upcoming meeting date for the RTMUA (October 17) and deferred comment to Police Chief, Al Payne, regarding the Police Department.

During Liaison Reports, Chief Payne advised that the Police Department will be wearing pink shields on their vests and selling bracelets during the month of October in support of breast cancer awareness; will be participating in "No Shave" November; and collecting Toys for Tots.

Mayor Kuhl advised that students from Hunterdon County Polytech will begin renovations on the schoolhouse on October 21st and will continue on Thursday and Friday afternoons; that there are resolutions on tonight's agenda appointing Class III special law enforcement officers as well as new hires for the Department of Public Works; and reiterated that the Planning Board approved an application for the installation of a clarifier by the end of the year to address odor issues in the municipality.

Deputy Mayor Mangin announced the upcoming meeting of the Board of Health (October 17) and that there will be a discussion on vaping. Deputy Mayor Mangin reported that Public Works has completed tar and chip seal, line striping and the paving of Bridal Path, and started leaf collection. Deputy Mayor Mangin also reported on new hires in Public Works.

At this time, Mayor Kuhl provided an update on the status of the reconstruction of Case Boulevard advising that the Township is awaiting New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) approval on the plans, as the Township received an NJDOT grant for this project and state approval is required.

Committee Member Reiner commented on the Raritan Township Fire Company's recent 9/11 Stair Climb advising that there were over two-hundred people in attendance.

Etzel Property Acquisition – Marie Newell, a representative of the New Jersey Conservation Foundation (NJCF), provided background on the property and spoke of the importance of preservation with respect to the Wickecheoke corridor. Ms. Newell explained that the Wickecheoke is a tributary that supplies drinking water for the Raritan canal; is a Class 1 category stream for trout production; and has flash flooding issues downstream. She continued that the corridor as well as the parcel has been identified by Hunterdon County, Raritan Township and the NJCF for preservation and protection.

Ms. Newell further explained that the Township has been awarded a Green Acres grant for up to \$500,000.00 for preservation and that she is seeking to secure \$147,500.00 this evening towards the preservation of this parcel.

Mayor Kuhl commented that the Open Space Advisory Committee has studied this parcel in depth.

Committee Member Gilbert extended gratitude to Ms. Newell for all of her efforts with the preservation of the Hollenback property.


