Section 1. **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SNOW REMOVAL OF PRIVATE ROADS
WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF RARITAN**

**A RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO INDEPENDENCE
CONSTRUCTORS TO INSTALL NEW FUEL DISPENSER AT THE

WHEREAS, the Township of Raritan is in need of installation of a new fuel dispenser at the Raritan Township Police Station; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Raritan is a member of the New Jersey State Cooperative Purchasing; and

WHEREAS, Independence Constructors, 1200 Route 22 East, Bridgewater, NJ 08807 has been awarded contract #42270 Aboveground Fuel Tanks: Installation, Removal and Repair and Related Equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Public Works recommends that Independence Constructors be awarded the contract to install the new fuel dispenser; and

WHEREAS, the cost of this will be at the bid price as documented by the New Jersey State Cooperative Purchasing and appropriated through Ordinance #19-13 for the amount of \$6,380.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds are available through Certificate of Availability of Funds #19-24 for installation of a new fuel dispenser at the Township Police Station.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Raritan, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that the contract for installation of a new fuel dispenser at the Raritan Township Police Station be awarded to Independence Constructors, 1200 Route 22 East, Bridgewater, NJ 08807 in the amount of \$6,380.00.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

The following members of the public spoke during public comment:

Sharon Winnick, a resident of 20 Monsey Road, asked for clarification of what was being moved to Wednesday during Committee Member Hazard's report; commented on the amount of Sycamore leaves in her neighborhood and requested that someone pick them up.

Gene Lewandowski, a resident of 3 Phipps Court, inquired as to the status of the Comcast Franchise Renewal and voiced opinion regarding the rates.

John MacKay, a resident of 122 Featherbed Lane, voiced opinion regarding Comcast and Century Link services; and spoke of a traffic issue on Route 31 in the vicinity of the former Mannon site. Mr. MacKay advised that traffic was backed up from Stop & Shop past Woodschurch Road. He continued to explain that traffic is “circumventing” Route 31 and utilizing back roads such as Featherbed Lane including buses, trucks and landscapers at speeds more than 35 mph.

During public comment, Committee Member Hazard clarified that the RTMUA meeting had been moved from Thursday to Wednesday with adequate notice; Mayor Kuhl advised that Public Works will be notified of the situation regarding the leaves raised by Ms. Winnick and suggested that Mr. MacKay email him his concerns regarding traffic issues.

A brief discussion was held regarding the Comcast Franchise renewal. Mr. Purcell explained that negotiations are still underway. Mr. Purcell further explained that the Township could entertain another company’s interest if approached, however, the Township cannot set rates. Mayor Kuhl added that Comcast owns the infrastructure unlike the telephone company and any changes would have to be through the Board of Public Utilities.

At this time, Mr. Hutchins advised that NJDOT has met with the Township and is holding a public information forum, October 8, 2019 at the Township Municipal Building regarding proposed Route 31 improvements. He continued that “Route 31 will be dualized at some point...from River Road all the way down through Stop & Shop...” Mr. Hutchins commented on the complexity of the improvements surrounding the railroad bridge near the Stothoff Company including removal of the bridge, lane expansion, and the moving of the railroad several miles in each direction. Mr. Hutchins added that information regarding the public information center will be posted on the Township website and forwarded to Curtis Leeds of Flemington-Raritan TapInto as well.

During the discussion, Ms. Winnick advised that October 8, 2019 is the eve of the most religious Jewish holiday, Yom Kippur. She continued to explain that there will be a lot of traffic from the Flemington Jewish Community Center (FJCC), as the congregation utilizes the Township municipal lot for overflow parking. She added that the services go on for hours.

Municipal Clerk, Lisa Fania, commented that the NJDOT public information center will be taking place from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Ms. Fania to advise NJDOT of the date conflict.

At this time, Mayor Kuhl announced that the Committee will reconvene closed session to discuss matters of Contract Negotiations and that the regular meeting will not reconvene and that no action will be taken.

Closed Session reconvened at 7:29 p.m.

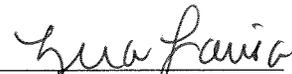
