REPORTS

Office of Emergency Management Update – Christopher Phelan, Raritan Township Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Coordinator, provided an update on the status of OEM efforts regarding the COVID-19 public health emergency. Mr. Phelan advised of the following:

*1,211 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Hunterdon County; 70 deaths;

*207 confirmed COVID-19 cases in Raritan Township; 22 deaths;

*103 total patients in the hospital; 227 patients discharged to recover at home from COVID with two COVID patients in the hospital at the time of this report;

*Private testing continues at the joint Hunterdon County site with Hunterdon Healthcare and at Walmart and CVS in Three Bridges;

*Effective September 4 per Executive Order #183 indoor dining, theaters and performance venues can resume at twenty-five percent capacity;

*NJEDA announced expansion of ten million dollars of their small business emergency assistance loan program.

During his report, Mr. Phelan reported that September is National Preparedness Month; reminded residents and businesses to register for the Township's Nixle emergency alert system and expressed gratitude to all first responders for their assistance during this difficult time.

LIAISON REPORTS

Karen Gilbert: Fire/Rescue/OEM; Open Space Advisory Committee; Planning Board (Class III Member)

(Deputy Mayor)

Deputy Mayor Gilbert referred to Mr. Phelan's report regarding Rescue and OEM; advised that the Open Space Advisory Committee did not meet; and reported that the Planning Board approved an amended application for the Junction Road affordable housing site which included an additional parcel to correct a road alignment issue per County requirements. Deputy Mayor Gilbert also commented that discussion was held with respect to naming The Willows and South Junction Road Redevelopment District developments, Junction Road North and Junction Road South, respectively. Deputy Mayor Gilbert also reported that the Township will be holding a Community Concert at Lenape Park, Sunday, October 4, 4:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. and that discussion regarding band selection and other details is underway.

Gary Hazard: Court; Open Space Advisory Committee; RTMUA

Committee Member Hazard reported that efforts are underway regarding the new shared court services agreement as the Township is taking on new courts; and announced the next meeting date of the RTMUA, September 17 and that Northlandz is holding a community event Saturday, September 5.

Mayor Kuhl reported that the Township is in good fiscal shape; that the Historians did not meet; reiterated Deputy Mayor Gilbert's comments regarding Planning Board approval of an amended application for the South Junction Road Redevelopment District; and advised that discussion is underway regarding the possibility of a small car show prior to the Community Concert.

Committee Member MacDade reported that members of the Environmental Commission are pursuing community forestry continuing education credits to help with the Township's State certification and that discussion is underway regarding the possibility of holding a clean-up day in late September at Lenape Park. Committee Member MacDade also reported on a meeting of the Board of Health advising that three septic waiver requests were approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Raritan Township Fire Company update on new fire truck – Keith Paradiso, Chief, Raritan Township Fire Company, appeared before the Committee and provided an update on the status of the purchase of the new fire truck. Chief Paradiso referred to a handout that included the following:

- *price of the Engine: \$758,838.87
- *trade in value: \$15,000.00
- *price of engine "in book:" \$743,839.87
- *chassis pre-payment discount: \$15,195.987

Total cost of the Engine with discounts (trade-in and chassis prepayment): \$728,644.00

Chief Paradiso explained that additional costs totaling \$21,000.00 would be required to outfit the truck including tool mounting (\$10,000.00) and hoses (\$11,000.00) which would bring the total final cost to \$749,644.00.

Chief Paradiso explained that the Fire Company is seeking the full \$750,000.00.

There was no further discussion nor objections. It was the consensus of the Committee that the fire company be granted the \$750,000.00 for the purchase of the new Engine.

2020-2021 Recycling & Non-recycling Program; 2021 Non-recycling and E-Waste permits – Mayor Kuhl referred to recommendations for the 2020-2021 recycling and non-recycling program provided by Recycling Coordinator, Kayla Hulcher and Public Works Superintendent, Brion Fleming. Mayor Kuhl advised that there were no changes to the fee schedule and other details except for the dates. There were no objections to the recommendations submitted.

Request to Participate in NJDEP's 2021 Radon Awareness Program – Municipal Clerk, Lisa Fania, explained that she was seeking approval to participate in the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's (NJDEP) Radon Awareness Program at this time due to the uncertainty of availability of funds as a result of COVID-19. There were no objections to Ms. Fania proceeding with the application upon availability from the State.

Hunterdon Healthcare Foundation's request for Raritan Township's participation in Hunterdon Strong Community Challenge – Mayor Kuhl referred to the information provided in the agenda packets. Mr. Hutchins explained that this request is a new fundraising initiative by Hunterdon Healthcare Foundation to benefit several non-profits as a result of not being able to hold its annual fundraising events due to COVID-19. Mr. Hutchins continued that the role of the Township would be to promote the event via social media outlets, the Township website and Nixle alert system. There were no objections to the Township participating.

**A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE SUPPORT OF
THE COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RARITAN FOR
VOTER CHOICE IN THE NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION**

WHEREAS, on August 14, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 177, requiring that every active registered voter be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot for the November General Election; and

WHEREAS, the Raritan Township Committee does not have jurisdiction overseeing elections, the Committee has received numerous emails and phone calls from concerned residents about an all vote-by-mail November General Election; and

WHEREAS, voting is a sacred democratic right that has been secured through social movements, protected in the courts, preserved on the battlefield by American veterans, and voters have a right to expect confidence in their choice of voting; and

WHEREAS, the Hunterdon County Clerk and Hunterdon County Board of Elections have and continue to do an outstanding job of educating voters about the vote-by-mail process including offering extensive resources on social media; and

WHEREAS, Hunterdon County Clerk Mary H. Melfi wisely called upon Governor Murphy to give voters the choice of in-person or vote-by-mail voting for the November General Election several weeks ago; and

WHEREAS, it has been deemed safe for a large number of indoor retail establishments to remain open and allow in-person activities that involve contact with large numbers of people; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has exempted political activities from his order restricting the indoor occupancy to twenty-five percent (25%) or 25 people and therefore allowing twenty-five percent (25%) of the occupancy of a room, up to 100 people for political purposes, which voting would certainly be considered; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Anthony Fauci, America's leading expert on infectious diseases, has stated that in-person voting is permissible with the proper protocols in place.


